

2. Goals for the coming year.

1. Change in the Junior Division at the 2009 state Soils Contest. A school will be able to bring two junior division teams with other possibilities in terms of participation to be reviewed in the future.
2. Change the definition for a student to participate in the Junior Division at the state contest. A junior is any individual or first time judge regardless of age to participate at the state level. Student may only participate in the junior division once in their high school years. After participating in the junior division, the student must participate in the senior division the next time they participate at the state contest. They cannot judge the junior division for multiple years.

(Rationale for both: This will allow more students the opportunity to participate and learn the soils evaluation contest)

3. Pursue funding to assist in the operating expenses in conducting the state contest. Expenses to be funded for are: trophies, busing, materials, and site selection.
4. Planning and organizing the 2008 State Soils Contest to be held with Farm Technology Days in Brown County. The Date is July 15th and Brillion FFA is the host chapter.
5. Continue and begin planning for the 2009 and 2010 contests. 2009 will be held on July 21st in Dodge County, 2010 will be in Pierce County.
